WORKING AND LIVING IN NEW TERRITORIES

The digitalization of work processes and the generalization of IT are creating unprecedented opportunities, including coworking, which is the subject of this book. An increasing part of the workforce is experimenting with new forms of work, as freelancers, self-employed or highly skilled employees with greater autonomy. All this is possible thanks to a largely internet-based professional activity. The pandemic has also reinforced this already existing social trend.

A new generation of workers seeking autonomy in both their professional and private spheres are setting the trend, with new attitudes towards work, life quality and environmental issues. Eager to more clearly articulate their preferences in their professional and private lives, many are using coworking spaces, increasingly outside the major metropolitan areas. This book brings together specialists from different disciplines (sociology, management, geography, economics, communication sciences) and different countries, in a comparative perspective, to understand the new models of work, mobility and life trajectories, and the increasing role of non-metropolitan coworking spaces.
